## What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in August 2023.

### Priority 1: Road Safety

**You said:** That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

**What we are going to do:** \*Speed Enforcement Patrols \*Partnership Working \*Issue Traffic Offence Reports (TORs)

### Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

**You Said:** Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes on open spaces was an issue to you.

**What we are going to do:** \*Targeted patrols \*Educational Events \*Partnership Working

### Priority 3: Burglary

**You Said:** Residential burglaries was a concern.

**What we are going to do:** \*Targeted patrols \*Educational and Target Hardening Events \*Partnership Working

## What we are doing

### Priority 1 Road Safety:

- Conducting Speeding Enforcement Patrols when the issue is most prevalent, sporadically but regularly across the beat area.
- Issue Traffic Offence Reports (TORs) for offences and keep you informed in relation to these.

### Priority 2 Antisocial Behaviour (ASB):

- Patrols of Parks and other recreational and business areas where ASB is being reported to be occurring.

### Priority 3 Burglary :

- Using data to examine patterns of crime and locations involved. From this, targeted patrols and specific operations can be organised to combat burglaries and apprehend those responsible.

## News



Following reports of Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Kirby Muxloe Castle, patrols are being carried out to deter inappropriate use of the Castle and its grounds. We have had reports of people swimming in the Moat during periods of hot weather. Police wish to remind everyone that such activity is highly dangerous and is to be discouraged, especially as the site does not have a permanent member of English Heritage on site. In 2021, there were 277 accidental drownings in the UK. 62% of these happened at inland waters and 83% of these were males. With the prospect of fine weather predicted during the early part of the month, advice is to keep out of the water and to report anyone found attempting to enter it.

### Change of Neighbourhood Policing Inspector.

On the 30th August Inspector Palmer handed over to Inspector Whittle as Command of Hinckley and Blaby Neighbourhood Policing Area who brings great experience and a broad policing background, including recently leading our Rural Policing Team.
